Body maps of people living with Chagas disease: Exhibition

Body mapping is a method of telling stories in which the creator's overall story and experience strongly contributes to the story's significance. Since 2002, body mapping has been used as both a therapeutic and research tool, primarily for people living with HIV/AIDS.

For the first time, this technique has been used as a research and advocacy tool for people living with Chagas disease, led by a Spanish researcher at Miguel Hernández

University, with colleagues from Germany (University of Munich (LMU)) and Bolivia (NGOs DAHW -Deutsche Lepra- und Tuberkulosehilfe e.V.- and NorSud).

Chagas disease is one of 20 Neglected Tropical Diseases caused by infection with *Trypanosoma cruzi*. This disease affects 6 million people worldwide and is the cause of death for roughly 7000 people each year. Originally confined to the American continent, it has become a global concern primarily due to international human migration.

In November 2018, twelve men and women living with Chagas disease were drawing from and sharing their personal experiences with the researchers in a Chagas disease hyperendemic region of Bolivia. Through the exhibition of these body maps we would like to share with the audience the challenges that patients living with Chagas disease face and what their remaining

unmet needs are. The final aim of this exhibition is to raise awareness concerning Chagas disease and we hope that you also enjoy it.
